

CHURCH LEADERSHIP DIVISION

CHURCH LEADERSHIP DIVISION

PASTOR'S TRAINING SUBDIVISION

Morning Classes 7:00 a.m.–9:30 a.m.

Pastor's Advanced Training Program (PATP). The PATP is an advanced study program intended for pastors who have completed Pastor's Alternative Training Certification (PATC). Pastors certified through the PATC program have this option to continue their Christian education growth through phases 2-4. These courses are directly related to the work of the Pastor. A pastor may attend these courses for general continuing education without enrolling for credit hours in the PAT Program of study.

9902—The Spiritual Life of the Minister

This course will explore the dimensions of spirituality that should characterize the life of the faithful minister. It will deal with his devotional life, his family relationships, and his time of study and meditation. It will share with the minister those activities that will keep him in touch with God and keep him ready to serve people effectively. This course is from phase 3 of PATP.

9923—Organizing the Church for Ministry and Mission

This course will examine the purpose and goals of the church. Students will look at models of ministry through intentional programs and organizational structures that will effectively meet the needs of the people. This course is from phase 4 of PATP.

Pastoral Leadership Joint Session. The courses in this section open each day with a joint session of preaching. This course is designed to examine God's call of the preacher. Students will be led to examine the calls of several biblical characters and how the calls affected their lives.
