Sunday School Publishing Board (SSPB) Curriculum Training Workshop

Participants will be introduced to the SSPB Curricula, which includes Sunday Church School Faith Series, Living the Baptist Faith, S.E.E.D. Discipleship Series, and Vacation Bible School. Practical tips will be given to maximize utilizing SSPB resources. Strategies will be discussed for recruiting, training, administering, and growing the church through Christian education.

2023—Creative Ways of Teaching

Assist teachers in discovering innovative ways to teach that lead to transforming students' lives, and discovering new ways of teaching that will include strategies of student learning and behavior.

2097—Rethinking Christian Education for Contemporary Innovations

Examine the current trends, methodologies, and practices in Christian education to determine their validity and alliance with the Scriptures. A requirement for instructor recertification. Must be taken every five (5) years.

2099A—Dean Certification (Part I)

Review the history of Christian education in the life of the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc. Primary emphasis will be centered on COPP, its founders, and its objectives. Students will also be introduced to the availability and concept of Specialization training. The course will include such vital information as enlistment and training of staff. The concept of Dean of Record (DOR) will be introduced. Students will become familiar with forms and procedures necessary for the management of schools, classes, and student progress.

2099B—Dean Certification (Part II)

Review the step-by-step procedures for accrediting Christian Leadership Schools, beginning with Step 1 (selecting and certifying a dean) and continuing through Step 13 (completing and submitting the final report), together with the dean's annual report to the state director. The concept of Dean of Record will be introduced to the students, along with a clear explanation of the certificate and specialization programs.

2099C—Dean Certification (Part III)

Lead a review of forms and administrative procedures. The students will be alerted to "hot spots" to be avoided by deans and presidents in the planning and supervision of the school as it progresses. Like wise, the students will learn steps for advising and monitoring individual students through the phases and programs of the Christian Leadership School system.

2099D—Dean Certification (Part IV)

Prepare the students for internship and the administration of that first school, and for advising and guiding individual students through CLS programs. Students will review the entire program of instruction. Emphasis will be placed on the enhancement of Christian education in all areas: COPP, Sunday school, Bible study programs, Training Union, and other teaching venues. The students will explore ways in which unity can be developed throughout the Convention's education ministry at the local, district, state, and national levels.

2100—Guidelines for Recertification of Deans

Instruct deans seeking recertification. Deans are required to be recertified every five (5) years. Contemporary issues in Christian education, trends, and methods will be addressed as a portion of this course. Must be taken every five (5) years.

7001—Building Healthy Churches (Phase 4 PATP)

Help leaders in the Local church understand the importance of being a healthy church in the community. Various biblical principles shall be studied to effectively move a stagnant ministry to a flourishing congregation.

7013—Developing Christian Black Men to Be Role Models

Teach biblical methods and models that will strengthen the black male. Some of the biblical models used will be Joseph, Nehemiah, Barnabas, and Paul.

7009—Developing a New Members Ministry

Develop a new members' ministry. Students will learn techniques for recruiting teachers and facilitators as well as the development of a course and curriculum design for the local church.

SP0019—Overcoming Leadership Distress

This course looks at both the causes and effects of leadership distress. Students will investigate ways to avoid negative stresses that will nullify effective leadership and program successes.

9024—The Computer in the Life of the Church (Phase 4 COPP)

Train pastors, office workers, Christian educators, and others who want to utilize computer technology in the church. Issues in administration, setting up computer

labs, tutorials on Bible study, as well as membership record keeping and nurture will be covered in this course.

Pastor's Alternative for Teacher Certification (PATC)

Because pastors have experience in leading and teaching, an alternative program of certification has been developed. Pastors or pastoral staff (associate preachers or ministry leaders with pastoral approval) with three or more years of ministry experience are eligible for the program. Participants will be required to complete twelve (12) hours of training in the alternative program. The program includes a hybrid emphasis of the following components:

- Introduction to COPP
- Christian education programs
- The role of Christian education director
- Creative ways of teaching
- Briefing on all courses required for COPP, with emphasis on Phase 1 Courses
- Pastor's Alternative Certificates will be awarded when the requirements have been met.

Because pastors have experience in leading and teaching, an alternative program of certification has been developed. Pastors or pastoral staff (associate preachers or ministry leaders with pastoral approval) with three or more years of ministry experience are eligible for the program. Participants will be required to complete twelve (12) hours of training in the alternative program. The program includes a hybrid emphasis of the following components:

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- Creative ways of teaching
- Briefing on all courses required for COPP, with emphasis on Phase 1 Courses
- Pastor's Alternative Certificates will be awarded when requirements have been met.

2097—Rethinking Christian Education for Contemporary Innovations

Examine the current trends, methodologies, and practices in Christian education to determine their validity and alliance with the Scriptures. A requirement for instructor recertification. Must be taken every five (5) years.

2099A-D—Guidelines for Dean Certification

Students will discuss the role and responsibilities of deans of Christian education. Sections of the *Christian Leadership School Manual* will be examined including the forms and thirteen steps for accrediting Christian Leadership Schools. Students will be grouped in one general session and divided into subgroups according to course A, B, C, D to cover

specific course content emphasis. Assignments will be given specific to the one course that will be credited. This is not the Dean's Fast Track.

2100—Guidelines for Recertification of Deans

Instruct deans seeking recertification. Deans are required to be recertified every five (5) years. Contemporary issues in Christian education, trends, and methods will be addressed as a portion of this course. Must be taken every five (5) years for dean recertification.

7010—Introduction to Discipleship (Phase 3 COPP)

Introduce the believer to the biblical principle of discipleship. Examine the character traits of believers, while looking at the overall examples of Jesus. Study discipleship methods of Jesus and the difference between discipleship and membership.

8035—The African-American Church and Social Justice (Phase 4 COPP & PATP) Investigate the lives, theology, and methods of the great servants of God who dedicated their lives in the struggle for liberation of people. Discuss the role of the African-American church in the struggle for the liberation of people.

9914—Connecting the Local Church to the Community (Phase 2 PATP)

Examine the mission of the church to serve the community. Consider the biblical mandate for the church to be missionaries to the community and serve the spiritual, social, and physical needs of the people therein. Help students to better understand the spiritual nature of the church, thus creating an incentive to reach out as servants to the community.

SP0032—Music and Worship

This course will look at music as an aid to worship. Students will examine different styles and genres of music and their relationship to varying styles and worship experiences. The study will include classical, contemporary, gospel, spirituals, jazz, hymns, and other traditional and nontraditional types of music.

Focus on the fourth gospel and its uniqueness. Identify the specific features that characterize John's gospel and distinguish it from the Synoptic Gospels, with emphasis on John's writings and the ministry of Jesus Christ.

2023—Creative Ways of Teaching

Assist teachers in discovering innovative ways to teach that lead to transformed students' lives, and discovering new ways of teaching that will include strategies of student learning and behavior.

2097—Rethinking Christian Education for Contemporary Innovations

Examine the current trends, methodologies, and practices in Christian education to determine their validity and alliance with the Scriptures. A requirement for instructor recertification. Must be taken every five (5) years.

2099A-D/2100—Guidelines for Certification/Recertification of Deans

Students will discuss the role and responsibilities of deans of Christian education. Sections of the *Christian Leadership School Manual* will be examined including the forms and thirteen steps for accrediting Christian Leadership Schools. Students will be grouped in one general session and divided into subgroups according to course A, B, C, D, or 2100 to cover specific course content emphasis. Assignments will be given specifically to the one course that will be credited. This is not the Dean's Fast Track.

3007—History of Baptists (Phase 3 COPP)

Examine the roots of the Baptist faith. Students will study the historical development of the Baptist denomination.

6013—Organizing the Church for Christian Education (Phase 4 COPP)

Focus on the various administrative and organizational skills needed to organize the Christian education department. Emphasis placed on structure, leadership, and staffing needs for Christian education.

7008—Reaching the Unchurched People

Teach strategies to reach unchurched people and identify the reasons why people leave church. Using the model of Jesus and the apostles, share the biblical principle of belonging to a fellowship of believers with a spirit of restoration.

8018—The Ministry of Church Nursing

Study the services provided by the nursing ministry of the church. Needs of this ministry, with special emphasis placed on the tasks appropriate for local church ministry, will be addressed. Health care resources and possible church health-related activities will be identified, including procedures for setting up a health fair and other programs to address the health needs of the community.

9005—Writing Techniques II (Phase 3 COPP)

Focus on the Certificate of Progress Program writing requirements for Phase 3. Emphasis will be placed on the writing of documented research and the development of other skills necessary to complete the writing assignments in this phase. Help introduce the students to the library and the use of reference materials.
