DEAN CERTIFICATION FAST TRACK

The Division of Christian Education Accreditation and Credentials (DCEAC) recognizes changing trends in education. The CLS Dean's Fast Track Option is designed for those persons who aspire to pursue dean's certification at an accelerated pace. Those who meet the requirements for the CLS Dean Fast Track Option are required to complete ten (10) hours of study. The Dean candidate must then satisfy all of the other requirements for dean's certification in order to complete the dean's certification process. Participants will need to register for this fast track between June 1, 2017–September 30, 2017.

To participate in the CLS Dean Fast Track, participant will need to meet the following requirements:

- Have completed COPP, PATP or have a Bible College or Seminary degree (Submit your transcript to the Division of Christian Education with registration.)
- Complete the Student Recommendation Form(on page 26 of this brochure).
- Complete all pre-work assignments prior to the Conference. (Pre-work will be emailed after registration for the CLS Dean Fast Track.)
- Compete all assignments and testing during the Conference.
- Purchase the CLS Manual, and a subscription to The Christian Education Informer.

SYNOPSIS OF SEMINARS

Building Strong and Healthy Family Ministries

This three-day seminar offers ministry leaders and persons searching for ways to launch, develop, strengthen, and increase the percentage of strong families and related ministries and initiatives in their church and community. These sessions will provide practical tools, proven biblical principles, and current resources that will aid them in implementing resilient and vibrant family ministries.

Credit Option: This seminar will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 8037, Administering the Family Ministry Program. **Facilitator:** Dr. Christopher Jackson

Deacons' Ministry Seminar

The Deacon's Ministry Seminar is designed to provide those persons who have been selected to serve as a deacon or who are currently serving as a deacon with training to be effective servants of the Christian Church. Participants will explore the concept of Christian spirituality, discuss the process of the spiritual life, and develop a plan for their spiritual life. Participants will explore the role and responsibility of the church deacon as an extension of the pastoral ministry. Attention will focus on biblical texts that support and influence the ministry of the church deacon.

Credit Option: This seminar will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 5012, Becoming an Effective Deacon. **Facilitator:** Dr. Walter Solomon Sr.

Deacons' Ministry: Advanced Leadership Seminar

This seminar will focus on developing and refining leadership and caring skills with deacons.

Credit Option: This seminar will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 5009, Group Leadership.

Organizing and Maintaining Successful Welcoming Ministries

This three-day seminar is designed for persons responsible for facilitating, coordinating, and/or directing their congregation's welcome ministries, which include ushers, parking lot attendants, greeters, and new member orientation. These sessions will provide participants a comprehensive plan and easy-to-use tools with which to create a climate and culture of hospitality, and to develop and maintain processes of follow-up, invitation, and intentional connection with guests and newcomers.

Trustees' Ministry Seminar

This three-day seminar will provide persons who have been selected to serve as trustees or who are currently serving as trustees an overview of their function as stewards of the property God has entrusted to their congregation. These sessions will offer numerous practical tips and tools, and will review current resources that will assist trustees in wisely supervising and maintaining both the physical property and gifts made to the congregation so that the ministries can be effective and all legal requirements related to the property are satisfied.

Superintendents' Seminar-Leadership Essentials: Level One

CHURCH LEADERSHIP DIVISION

PASTORS' AND MINISTERS' SUBDIVISION

This section is designed to aid pastors in understanding their role of moving people from membership to discipleship. Pastors will listen to strategies and share in discussions with other pastors regarding ministry for the twenty-first century. The afternoon sessions open each day with a joint session of preaching by one of our venerable NBCUSAI pastors of the age.

The Pastor's Alternative for Teacher Certification (PATC) Program is designed to provide an avenue for teacher certification for pastors with at least three years of pastoral experience. The Pastor's Advanced Training Program (PATP) is an advanced study program intended for pastors who have completed Pastor's Alternative Certification (PATC). Pastors certified through the PATC program have this option to continue their Christian Education growth. A pastor may attend these courses for general continuing education without enrolling for credit hours in the PATC program of study.

MORNING CLASSES

1079—Survey of John (New Testament Studies)

This course will identify the specific features that characterized John's gospel and distinguishes it from the Synoptic Gospels, with emphasis on John's understanding of the life, and ministry of Jesus Christ. Students will be provided with tools and resources for teaching a Survey of John.

Instructor: Dr. Johnny Flakes III, Columbus, GA

The Issues Surrounding the Church and Politics: Maintaining a Prophetic Voice in Times of Political Uncertainty (PATP)

This course will address the issues surrounding the church and politics, in general, and the African-American church in particular. The absence of the prophetic pulpit in addressing the concerns that challenge our people today will be covered in this course. Credit Option: This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 9922—The History and Continuing Role of the African-American Church in America.

Instructor: Dr. Robert C. Scott, Charlotte, NC

Pastor's Alternative for Teacher Certification (PATC)

This course is designed to provide an avenue for teacher certification for pastors with at least three years of pastoral experience. Admission into the program requires a letter from the church that verifies three years in the pastorate, or letters from two or more churches that constitute three years of pastoral experience. The course consists of orientation to the work of the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc., The Sunday School Publishing Board, and the Division of Christian Education. A cursory examination of creative ways of teaching is a part of this course instruction.

AFTERNOON CLASSES

1056—Survey of Jonah (Old Testament Studies)

This study will examine the Old Testament prophetic book that exhibits God's love for all people—Pagans and Gentiles, as well as His chosen people. Students will learn the message of salvation and its availability for all people.

9921—Pastoral Leadership in Financing and Budgeting the Work of the Church (PATP)

This course will present a practical approach to financing and budgeting the work of the church; and, guide the students through basic practices and requirements for the responsible use of financial resources. The course will present new ideas, confirm standard practices, and help the pastor to avoid common management errors.

Reaching the Unchurched: Pathway to Church Growth (PATP)

This course will provide pastors with strategies and techniques to lead a congregation through change and growth. Participants will consider the providence of God in His work to prepare the church for the 21st century. Credit Option: This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 9924, Congregational Leadership in the Twenty-first Century. Instructor: Dr. Michael W. Wesley Sr., Birmingham, AL

Running on Empty: Overcoming and Avoiding Ministerial Burnout (PATP)

This course will examine the personal and professional demands of church leadership on the life of the pastor. The participants will look at the cause and effect of ministerial burnout, the need to care for self, and offer strategies that will enable pastors to renew and replenish their own spiritual energy. This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 9902—The Spiritual Life of the Minister.

CHURCH MINISTRIES SUBDIVISION

This subdivision provides in depth opportunities for training of church leaders in specific areas of ministry in the local church. The areas of ministry highlighted for this 39th annual conference are evangelism, Christian education, Intergenerational Ministry, and Young Adult Ministry. These classes are both informational and inspirational.

MORNING CLASSES

Evangelism Ministry: Equipping and Engaging a New Generation

This course is designed to train the church leaders and members to be outward-focused-faithful to the Great Commandment and the Great Commission. Creative church evangelism includes global and local missions, Christian service and outreach. Come prepared to share your best practices and models, to be replicated by others. Credit Option: This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 7005, Christian Evangelism.

Young Adult Ministry: Equipping and Engaging a New Generation

What does it look like for local churches to be truly committed to reaching young adults aged 18-35 in and outside of their congregations? What are the essentials of a highly effective Young Adult Ministry? Come and discover innovative and practical ways that any congregation can reach, engage, and minister to and with young adults in both their churches and communities. Credit Option: This course may be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 2060, Reaching and Keeping Those Under 40, or course 2061, Millennials in Ministry. Instructor: Rev. AFTERNOON CLASSES

Intergenerational Ministry: Leading and Engaging Across Generations

With four different generations currently comprising many churches around the world, understanding the motivating factors of each generation promotes productivity and effective ministry collaboration. This engaging and interactive course is designed to focus on how we attend one another where we are—our congregations, families, and ministries—with the understanding that our participation in God's mission happens at every age and stage of life. Credit Option: This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course SP0010, Making Christian Education a Lifelong Experience.

Christian Education Ministry: Equipping and Engaging a New Generation

This course is designed to provide Christian educators with practical strategies/resources for mission and ministries. Various lectures and modules have been planned to complement the biblical text for our contemporary challenges as educators in the twenty-first century. Credit Option: This course will be accepted as an equivalency credit for course 6013, Organizing the Church for Christian Education.

CURRICULUM SUBDIVISION

This subdivision is designed to prepare and equip participants with training and practical insights into developing, organizing, and implementing curriculum based ministries and resources.

AFTERNOON CLASS

Living the Baptist Faith (Pastors are welcomed)

This course is designed to help participants in knowing, understanding, and embracing their unique Baptist identity, history, doctrines, beliefs, and wonderful distinctive. The course will introduce students to a new and improved Living the Baptist Faith (formerly Baptist Training Union) series. Credit Options: This course may be accepted as an equivalency credit for Certificate of Progress Program (COPP) course 2011, Baptist Doctrine and Pastors' Advanced Training Program (PATP) course 9906, Baptist Beliefs and Practices.

CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP SCHOOL DIVISION

CERTIFICATION SUBDIVISION

This subdivision is designed to acquaint moderators, congress presidents, state directors, deans, and instructors with the policies and procedures governing Christian Leadership Schools that function under the auspices of the local church, district, state, or the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc.

MORNING CLASSES

2097—Rethinking Christian Education for Contemporary Innovations

This course will examine the current trends, methodologies, and practices in Christian education to determine their validity and alliances with the Scriptures. (Requirement for Instructor Recertification)

2099B—Dean Certification (Part II)

This course will review the thirteen steps for accrediting Christian Leadership Schools.

2099C—Dean Certification (Part III)

This course will review forms and administrative procedures in the planning and supervision of the Christian Leadership School.

This course challenges the students to identify and confront contemporary issues affecting the church, home, and community. They will be encouraged to think through practical solutions and approaches to immediate and emerging social and ecclesiological concerns. (Phase 4)

Instructor: Rev. Kenneth A. Allen, Omaha, NE

9008—Public Speaking (Speech Communications)

This course will identify the process and principles for writing speeches and delivering them in public. It will relay basic verbal and nonverbal communications skills to enable the students to effectively communicate with audiences of all sizes. (Teacher Certification Requirement)

Instructor: Dr. Carolyn L. Gordon, Benoit, MS

AFTERNOON CLASSES 1112—Survey of Revelation

This course will explore the book of Revelation, with emphases on authorship, date, theme, and recipients. Prophetic themes, symbols and interpretations of various revelations will be discussed. (Phase 4)

2007—Christian Stewardship

This course will cover the basics of Christian stewardship—time, talent, and tithe. Students will begin to understand how to effectively manage their resources through a better understanding of the spiritual principles, practices, and contributions of Christian stewardship. (Phase 2)

2099D—Dean Certification (Part IV)

This course will prepare the students for internship and the administration of their first school, along with advising and guiding individual students through CLS programs.

Instructor: Rev. Benjamin E. V. Lett, Athens, GA

2100—Guidelines for Recertification of Deans

This course is designed for deans seeking recertification. Deans are required to be recertified every five (5) years. Students will discuss the roles and responsibilities of deans and their relationship with state directors. Contemporary issues in Christian education, trends, and methods will be addressed as a portion of this course.

7010—Introduction to Christian Discipleship

This course is designed to introduce the believer to the biblical principle of discipleship. The course will examine the character traits of believers, while looking at the overall examples of Jesus. Students will study discipleship methods of Jesus and the difference between discipleship and membership.

8035—The African-American Church and Social Justice

This course investigates the lives, theology, and methods of the great servants of God who dedicated their lives in the struggle for liberation of people. The course also discusses the role of the African-American church in the struggle for the liberation of people. (Phase 4)

Instructor: Rev. Thomas N. Bessix Sr., Lewisville, TX

SPECIALIZATION EDUCATION STUDIES PROGRAM SUBDIVISION

The Specialization Education Studies Program (SESP) is an advanced study program intended for those students who have completed the four phases of the Certificate of Progress Program (COPP). It is designed for those persons desiring to focus on a selected area of Christian ministry. However, any interested delegate can register for specialization courses.

MORNING CLASSES SP0018—Spiritual Leadership

This course will use biblical principles to assist ministry leaders in the development of effective leadership practices that are in keeping with biblical teachings. (Church Administration and Leadership)


