Key Verse:

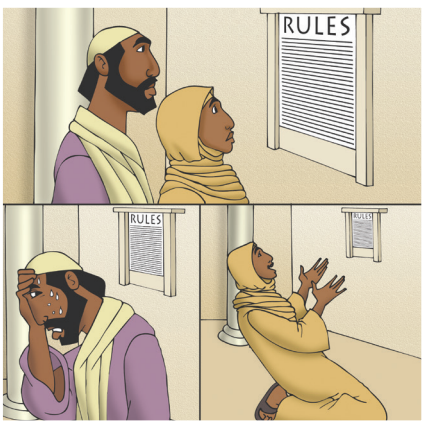

Changing Our Ways

(Jeremiah 22:1-10)



God told Jeremiah to go to the palace of the king. God wanted Jeremiah to tell the king and the people to do what is *just* (fair) and right. They were supposed to protect the people who needed help and those who could not protect themselves. They must not kill those who are *innocent*, people who have not done anything wrong.

If they did what God said, they would keep being leaders of the people. But if not, God would take away their kingdom and destroy it.

If the rulers were doing wrong, they had to change their ways!

Dear Parents/Guardians,

Today, your child heard about how God sent Jeremiah to tell the king and the people to change their ways. They were to lead in a godly way. God warned about the destruction of those who refused to protect the helpless and innocent. While reviewing this lesson with your child, talk about people in need—those who may be sick, hungry, homeless, etc. Suggest ways to help those people.
