**Background Scripture:** John 13:1-35 **Print Passage:** John 13:1-15, 34-35

# **Key Verse(s):**

I have given you an example, that ye should do as I have done to you. (John 13:15, KJV)

"I have set you an example that you should do as I have done for you." (John 13:15, NIV)

### **Questions to Consider:**

- Why did Peter object to Jesus washing His feet?
- What was Jesus teaching His disciples in this week's lesson about serving others?

### **Lesson Aims:**

As a result of experiencing this lesson, the participants should be able to do these things:

- Consider the significance of Jesus' washing the disciples' feet.
- Repent of pride that has prevented their serving selflessly.
- Serve others as an expression of Christian love.

### **Lesson Context:**

- John Chapter 13 marks the end of Jesus' <u>public</u> ministry and the beginning of His private ministry to His disciples.
- This is a lesson about serving others with an attitude of humility and love.
- Jesus gave final instructions to prepare His disciples for His death and resurrection, and events that would change their lives forever.

## **Lesson Outlines/Key Points:**

I. A Reversal of Roles (John 13:1-5)

Jesus **loved** His disciples. He was preparing to physically leave them.

II.	Misunderstanding and Rejection (John 13:6-15)  Jesus was teaching that the spiritual cleansing of the redeemed at salvation does not have to be
	repeated. All that is needed is the <u>daily</u> cleansing from the defilement of the sin dwelling within.
•	A New Kind of Love (John 13:34-35)  Jesus gave His disciples a charge to follow His example.  Jesus says that our Christlike love will show that we are His disciples. It will show up in our love and service to other.
Lasson	n Summary:
•	Jesus taught that our <u>love</u> for one another should be manifested in our <u>service</u> to others.  Christians are called to love one another by <u>serving</u> even in undesirable roles.
