John 1:37-51

Background Scriptures:

John 1:37-51; 4:25-42

Print Passages:

John 4:25-42

Key Verse(s):

Many of the Samaritans of that city believed on him for the saying of the woman, which testified, He told me all that ever I did. (John 4:39, KJV)

• • • • •

Many of the Samaritans from that town believed in him because of the woman's testimony, "He told me everything I ever did." (John 4:39, NIV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. Why did Jesus say He had to go through Samaria?
- 2. What did Jesus offer the woman at the well?
- 3. What did the woman of the well do in response to Jesus' offer?

Lesson Aims:

As a result of experiencing this lesson, you should be able to do these things:

- Identify the barriers Jesus crossed in conversing with the Samaritan woman.
- Sense the wonder the Samaritan woman felt in her encounter with Jesus.
- Share with others the transforming power of God at work in your lives.

Lesson Context:

- The Jews did everything they could to avoid traveling through <u>Samaria</u>. Their relationship with the Samaritans was hostile.
- Jesus knew the long history of cultural tension and theological differences between <u>Jews</u> and Samaritans.
- Jesus passed through Samaria and intentionally engaged in a conversation with someone who
 was not only a Samaritan, but also a <u>woman</u>.

► Lesson Outlines/Key Points:

I. She <u>Calls</u> (John 4:25-30)

Key Point 1: Despite the differences between Judaism and Samaritan religious traditions and belief, the woman at the well had a clear understanding of the <u>promised</u> Messiah.

Key Point 2: The woman invited many others to come hear the Man who told her all about herself.

I. He Calls (John 4:31-38)

Key Point 1: Jesus knew that the time for the Samaritans to hear the gospel was <u>ripe</u>. Key Point 2: God calls every believer to help labor for the <u>harvest</u> of souls for the kingdom. Some will plant, others will water—but when the harvest is ripe, God will give the increase.

II. We Cling (John 4:39-42)

Key Point 1: Based on the testimony of the woman who was at the well, many Samaritans came to believe in Jesus.

Key Point 2: The people who came to receive Jesus responded to the Word they received from the Lord.

► Lesson Summary:

What Do You Think?

- When Jesus made plans to minister to souls in Samaria, He used one woman, perhaps one that others would have overlooked for the task.
- Every believer is called to proclaim the Gospel of Jesus Christ every chance we get.
- Just imagine the power of one—one person, one effort, one witness for the Lord and the impact it can have on many.
