Background Scriptures:

Exodus 12:28-50; Deuteronomy 18:15-22

Print Passages:

Deuteronomy 18:15-22

Key Verse(s):

The Lord thy God will raise up unto thee a Prophet from the midst of thee, of thy brethren, like unto me; unto him ye shall hearken.

(Deuteronomy 18:15, KJV)

••••

The Lord your God will raise up for you a prophet like me from among you, from your fellow Israelites. You must listen to him.

(Deuteronomy 18:15, NIV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. What was Moses' final message to the children of Israel as they prepared to possess the Promised Land?
- 2. What are the guidelines for determining a true prophet of God?

Lesson Context:

- Moses had led the people to a point where they could <u>see</u> the Promised Land.
- In his final days of leading the nation, Moses delivered a series of messages to the people of Israel regarding how they were to enter the Promised Land and how they were to <u>live</u> when they arrived and had conquered and settled the land.
- Moses repeatedly reminded the people of their responsibility to remain steadfastly committed to their <u>covenant</u> relationship with God.

▶ Lesson Aims:

As a result of experiencing this lesson, the participants should be able to do these things:

- Study Moses' role as a prophet of God in leading the Israelites out of Egypt.
- Reflect on leaders who guide us through seemingly impossible situations.
- Completely rely on God in resolving challenging situations.

		Key Point 2: Rather than hearing the voice of God directly, the people wanted God to appoint a spokesman to represent Him and speak His Word to them.
