# **Devotional Reading:**

Psalm 25:1-10

## **Background Scriptures:**

2 Kings 22

#### **Print Passages:**

2 Kings 22:14-20

#### **Key Verse(s):**

Because thine heart was tender, and thou hast humbled thyself before the Lord, when thou heardest what I spake against this place, and against the inhabitants thereof, that they should become a desolation and a curse, and hast rent thy clothes, and wept before me; I also have heard thee, saith the Lord. (2 Kings 22:19, KJV)

• • • • •

"'Because your heart was responsive and you humbled yourself before the Lord when you heard what I have spoken against this place and its people—that they would become a curse and be laid waste—and because you tore your robes and wept in my presence, I also have heard you, declares the Lord." (2 Kings 22:19, NIV)

#### Questions to Consider:

- 1. What actions did Josiah take after hearing the "Book of the Law" being read?
- 2. What was God's message to Josiah as related to him by the prophetess Huldah?
- 3. What did God promise to Josiah, and why?

#### Lesson Context:

- At the age of twenty-six, During the 18th year of his reign, <u>Josiah</u> led a reform of the people to follow God after the <u>Book of Law</u> was found in the Temple.
- During the process of restoration, Hilkiah found a Book of the Law in the Temple and delivered it to Shaphan the scribe, who read the book to King Josiah (2 Kings verses 9-10).
- Upon hearing the Word of the Law, Josiah was deeply moved and tore his cloths in an act of humility, guilt, remorse, and deep sadness (verse 11).

#### Lesson Aims:

As a result of experiencing this lesson, the participants should be able to do these things:

- Analyze the prophetess Huldah's message from God for King Josiah.
- Reflect on Josiah's behavior after hearing the words of the Book of the Law.
- Seek godly advice about your future.

## ► Lesson Outlines/Key Points:

I. A Rebellious People's Calamity (2 Kings 22:14-17)

Key Point 1: The prophetess Huldah sent God's message to Josiah.

Key Point 2: God's wrath and calamity would be poured out on Israel because of their persistent sin of idolatry.

II. A *Pious* King's Consolation (2 Kings 22:18-20)

Key Point 1: God's message to Josiah was one of **judgment** but tempered with **mercy**.

Key Point 2: Judgement was sure, but God informed Josiah that is would not come during his lifetime.

### **▶** Lesson Summary:

- Josiah was so moved after hearing the Word of God that he responded by calling for spiritual reforms.
- God recognized and rewarded Josiah's faithfulness in seeking wisdom for Judah and for himself.
- As we read, study, and hear God's Word, we too should be encouraged not only to listen but to obey and respond in repentance and obedient faith.
