DEVOTIONAL READING: Psalm 25:1-10 **BACKGROUND SCRIPTURE:** 2 Kings 22 **PRINT PASSAGE:** 2 Kings 22:14-20

Key Verse(s):

Because thine heart was tender, and thou hast humbled thyself before the Lord, when thou heardest what I spake against this place, and against the inhabitants thereof, that they should become a desolation and a curse, and hast rent thy clothes, and wept before me; I also have heard thee, saith the Lord.

(2 Kings 22:19, KJV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. What actions did Josiah take after hearing the "Book of the Law" being read?
- 2. What was God's message to Josiah as related to him by the prophetess Huldah?
- 3. What did God promise to Josiah, and why?

Lesson Context:

- At the age of twenty-six, During the 18th year of his reign, _____ led a reform of the people to follow God after the _____ __ was found in the Temple.
- During the process of restoration, Hilkiah found a Book of the Law in the Temple and delivered it to Shaphan the scribe, who read the book to King Josiah (2 Kings verses 9-10).
- Upon hearing the Word of the Law, Josiah was deeply moved and tore his cloths in an act of humility, guilt, remorse, and deep sadness (verse 11).

- Reflect on Josiah's behavior after hearing the words of the Book of the Law.
