Isaiah 29

#### **Print Passages:**

Isaiah 29:13-24

#### **Key Verse(s):**

They also that erred in spirit shall come to understanding, and they that murmured shall learn doctrine. (Isaiah 29:24, KJV)

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"Those who are wayward in spirit will gain understanding; those who complain will accept instruction." (Isaiah 29:24, NIV)

#### Questions to Consider:

- 1. Why did the Isaiah condemn Judah's worship?
- 2. What happens when true worship occurs?
- 3. What does Isaiah say about the promise of a future transformation that will be vastly different?

#### Lesson Context:

- The book of Isaiah contains both prose and poetry and uses personification. Many of the
  prophecies in Isaiah contain predictions that foretell a soon-to-occur event and a distant future
  event at the same time.
- Isaiah called upon Judah, Israel, and the surrounding nations to <u>repent</u> of their sins and warned them of God's judgment and punishment.
- After condemning the nation for the emptiness of their <u>worship</u>, Isaiah prophesied that God would restore His people after He had judged them for their sins.

#### ▶ Lesson Aims:

As a result of experiencing this lesson, the participants should be able to do these things:

- Consider how God's promise of mercy will triumph over God's judgment.
- Believe that the essential nature of God is forgiveness, not punishment.
- Rejoice in the manifestation of God's love in your own life.
