Key Verse(s):

They also that erred in spirit shall come to understanding, and they that murmured shall learn doctrine. (Isaiah 29:24, KJV)

“Those who are wayward in spirit will gain understanding; those who complain will accept instruction.” (Isaiah 29:24, NIV)

Questions to Consider:

1. Why did the Isaiah condemn Judah's worship?
2. What happens when true worship occurs?
3. What does Isaiah say about the promise of a future transformation that will be vastly different?

Lesson Context:

- The book of Isaiah contains both prose and poetry and uses personification. Many of the prophecies in Isaiah contain predictions that foretell a soon-to-occur event and a distant future event at the same time.
- Isaiah called upon Judah, Israel, and the surrounding nations to _____ of their sins and warned them of God's judgment and punishment.
- After condemning the nation for the emptiness of their _____, Isaiah prophesied that God would restore His people after He had judged them for their sins.
