Key Verse(s):

Jeremiah said unto Zedekiah, If I declare it unto thee, wilt thou not surely put me to death? and if I give thee counsel, wilt thou not hearken unto me? (Jeremiah 38:15, KJV)

Jeremiah said to Zedekiah, "If I give you an answer, will you not kill me? Even if I did give you counsel, you would not listen to me." (Jeremiah 38:15, NIV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. Why did Zedekiah call for Jeremiah?
- 2. What was Jeremiah's message to Zedekiah?
- 3. Why was Zedekiah so fearful of surrendering to the Babylonians?
- 4. Why did Zedekiah reject the word of the Lord?

Lesson Context:

- Jeremiah repeatedly appealed to the people of Judah to repent and escape God's coming judgment.
- Jeremiah's passionate calls for repentance from sin and return to God fell on deaf ears.
- The main theme of Jeremiah is a judgment upon Judah for her apostasy and the promise of future restoration through God's ______and _____.
