Unit I: Jesus Teaches about Faith

DEVOTIONAL READING: Isaiah 38:16-20 **BACKGROUND SCRIPTURE:** Matthew 14:22-33 **PRINT PASSAGE:** Matthew 14:22-33

Key Verse(s):

Immediately Jesus stretched forth his hand, and caught him, and said unto him, O thou of little faith, wherefore didst thou doubt? (Matthew 14:31, KJV)

Immediately Jesus reached out his hand and caught him. "You of little faith," he said, "why did you doubt?" (Matthew 14:31, NIV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. What did Jesus do after He instructed His disciples to go to the other side?
- 2. What happened to Peter when he took his eyes off Jesus?
- 3. What did the disciples do when Jesus and Peter entered the boat?

Lesson Context:

- The disciples, along with many other people, had seen Jesus do many great miracles. However, as recorded by Matthew, none of the disciples had recognized the Lordship of Jesus.
- The second recorded occasion of Jesus' rescuing His disciples from a potential boating storm disaster on the Sea of Galilee is presented in this week's lesson.
- This storm that the disciples encountered in this lesson had the purpose of displaying Jesus' glory as the Son of God.
- Jesus' walking on water in Matthew 14 and calming the storm in Matthew 8 illustrate the power of God over His creation.

Lesson Aims

As a result of experiencing this lesson, you should be able to do these things:

- Recall the amazing story of the storm at sea followed by Jesus' appearance walking on the water. Repent of
 your failure to trust in God when caught up in a crisis.
- Develop habits of trust that enable you to overcome your doubt about God's care.

LESSON OUTLINES/KEY POINTS:

I. Disaster Comes (Matthew 14:22-24)

Key Point 1: Jesus sends the crowd away and retreats to a place to pray.

Key Point 2: The disciples found themselves in the midst of a storm.

II. Divinity Comes (Matthew 14:25-30)

Key Point 1: Jesus calms and reassures the Disciples.

Key Point 2: Peter walked on the water, trusting in Jesus.

III. Doubt Comes (Matthew 14:31-33)

Key Point 1: Jesus rescues Peter in the midst of the storm.

Key Point 2: Peter got to see and experience the power of Jesus as he walked in the storm.

Lesson Summary:

- Jesus wants us to have absolute trust in Him.
- Jesus does not always rescue us from the storm, but by faith He can keep us through the storm.
- When we face challenges in life, we must remember that God is always near.
