Print Passage:

Romans 5:1-11

Key Verse(s):

Therefore, being justified by faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

(Romans 5:1, KJV)

Therefore, since we have been justified through faith, we have peace with God through our Lord Jesus Christ.

(Romans 5:1, NIV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. What is justification and what does it bring to the life of a Christian?
- 2. What does it mean to have peace with God?
- 3. What does Paul say about reconciliation?

Lesson Context:

- In Romans, Paul shares with the Christians in Rome the fundamentals of his message about Jesus Christ and what God had accomplished through His death and resurrection.
- This week's lesson deals with the effects of the righteousness by faith upon the believer. It addresses reconciliation and justification by God through our faith.
- In Romans 5:6-11, Paul says that before reconciliation we were powerless, ungodly, sinners, and enemies; we were under God's wrath (verse 9).
- Justification means that those who receive salvation are declared to be right with God.
- God has justified us through the death of His Son and given us a new standing or a new relationship with Him through our Lord, Jesus Christ.
- Repent of personal failures to obtain the peace that God gives.
- Celebrate your justification through faith in Christ.

▶ Lesson Aims:

- Identify the relationship between faith in Christ and justification in the sight of God.
- Repent of personal failures to obtain the peace that God gives.
- Celebrate your justification through faith in Christ.

	•	Christ <u>died</u> to deliver the world from the penalty of sin. Because of Christ's sacrificial death, we have been justified before God, or pronounced " <u>guiltless</u> ." Having been justified by faith through the blood of Christ, we are at peace with God and have access to God's grace.
	•	Through Christ, believers have been adopted into the family of God and inherited eternal life.
