## **LESSON 13—August 29, 2021**

**Devotional Reading: Romans 7:14-26** 

**Background Scripture:** 2 Corinthians 4:16–5:10

Print Passage: 2 Corinthians 4:16-18; 5:1-10

## **Key Verse(s):**

We know that if our earthly house of this tabernacle were dissolved, we have a building of God, an house not made with hands, eternal in the heavens.

(2 Corinthians 5:1, KJV)

We know that if the earthly tent we live in is destroyed, we have a building from God, an eternal house in heaven, not built by human hands.

(2 Corinthians 5:1, NIV)

### Questions to Consider:

- 1. What does the Apostle Paul say about our present afflictions and how Christians should respond?
- 2. How does the Apostle Paul describe our earthly bodies in comparison to our resurrected bodies?
- 3. What is going to happen when we stand before the judgment seat of Christ?

#### Lesson Context:

- Paul reminded the Christians at Corinth that they must <u>never</u> lose heart and become discouraged.
- Paul encouraged the faithful to stay committed to the truth and reaffirmed his deep love for them.
- Paul reminded the church at Corinth that they must remain vigilant because the trials they had to endure were only temporary, light afflictions when weighed against the glory of eternity.

#### Lesson Aims:

As a result of experiencing this lesson, the participants should be able to do these things:

- Acknowledge the hope that Paul, when faced with death, manifested in God's eternal promise.
- Experience awe in the faith of family and friends who are facing their mortality.
- Develop a growing trust in God's promise of eternal life through faith.

#### ► Lesson Outlines/Key Points:

I. Focus (2 Corinthians 4:16-18)

**Key Point 1:** Paul offered words of **encouragement** to the suffering saints.

**Key Point 2:** Believers are exhorted to look beyond this present age and world to that which is to come.

#### II. Forecast (2 Corinthians 5:1-5)

**Key Point 1:** Paul contrasts our earthly bodies to our future resurrected bodies.

**Key Point 2:** The Holy Spirit within us is our guarantee that God will give us everlasting bodies at the resurrection.

### III. <u>Future</u> Fate (2 Corinthians 5:6-10)

**Key Point 1:** Christians are to continue to labor and work until God's plan for them is complete.

**Key Point 2:** Everyone will stand before God to receive a just reward for the deeds of our lives.

## Lesson Summary:

- Believers can be assured that when life reaches its conclusion, God has a more glorious future in store—an eternal future that will never fade away
- Having faith in God gives us hope to persevere through life and reminds us that, for the Christian, the life to come is far better than this one.
- Paul challenged his readers to persevere through life's peaks and valleys, successes and failures with an unshakable hope and faith.
- Knowing that we have an eternal possession in glory, Paul wrote that we must not faint, but move onward and upward by God's sustaining, renewing presence.
