Lesson Context

- The book of 1 John was written to a church that was in deep trouble.
- There were troubles concerning the teaching that was taking place in the church, unethical and moral conduct, and the members had become fragmented from each other.
- There were teachers who denied the humanity of Jesus and denied that Jesus of Nazareth was the Christ, the incarnate Word of God, and the only begotten Son of the Father.
- In this epistle, John confronts those who would sow _____ and _____ in the church.

- To grow stronger in knowledge and discernment and to avoid being deceived by false teachers, believers must devote themselves to the Word of God in private devotion, study, and participating in Bible study, Sunday school, and other areas of biblical training.
- In this week's lesson, the Apostle John reminds us that God has called every believer to love others, having a love that is evident in our actions and words.
- People are incapable of loving others the way they should, without the active leading and help of the Holy Spirit.
