Unit I. God's People Offer Praise

Devotional Reading: Exodus 105:1-2, 37-45 **Background Scripture:** Exodus 14:1–15:21 Print Passage: Exodus 15:11-21

Key Verse(s):

Who is like unto thee, O LORD, among the gods? Who is like thee, glorious in holiness, fearful in praises, doing wonders? (Exodus 15:11, KJV)

"Who among the gods is like you, LORD? Who is like you-majestic in holiness, awesome in glory, working wonders?" (Exodus 15:11, NIV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. What was Moses and the children of Israel singing about?
- 2. Why are the nations that Israel would face on their way to the land of Canaan fearful?
- 3. What did Miriam do?

Lesson Context:

- In Exodus chapter 14, the children of Israel journeyed through the desert and arrived at the
- The Lord sent a great wind which caused the waters of the red sea to part as Israel walked through on dry ground (see Exodus 14:13-30).
- When they safely reached the other side, Moses began to lead the men in singing in celebration of God's great victory at the red sea.

- Key Point 2: Miriam leads the women in singing, dancing, shouting, and praising God.
