Devotional Reading: Revelation 1:9-17

Background Scripture: Revelation 11

Print Passage: Revelation 11:15-19

Key Verse(s):

The seventh angel sounded; and there were great voices in heaven, saying, The kingdoms of this world are become the kingdoms of our Lord, and of his Christ; and he shall reign for ever and ever.

(Revelation 11:15, KJV)

"The seventh angel sounded his trumpet, and there were loud voices in heaven, which said: "The kingdom of the world has become the kingdom of our Lord and of his Messiah, and he will reign for ever and ever." (Revelation 11:15, NIV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. What happened when the seventh angel sounded his trumpet?
- 2. What were the multitude of people doing in heaven?
- 3. Why were the nations angry, and to whom is their anger directed?

Lesson Context:

Chapter 11 ends with a <u>celebration</u> of praise as the seventh, final trumpet is blown. The final trumpet blast is followed by shouts and choruses of praise in the heavens—as there is excitement over the final consummation of the ages coming to pass.

Lesson Aims:

As a result of experiencing this lesson, you should be able to do these things:

- Define the nature of God's reign for eternity.
- Reflect on how God's eternal reign affects our faith.
- Engage in activities that reflect the sovereignty of God in healthy, powerful, and transforming ways.

► Lesson Outlines/Key Points:

I. Reverence for the Reign (Revelation 11:15-17)

Key Point 1: God receives praise and celebration for ruling the whole earth.

Key Point 2: Christ is going to rule and reign the kingdoms of this world forever and forever.

II.	Rejoice for the Reward (Revelation 11:18-19)	
	Key Point 1: The judgment of God has arrived.	
	Key Point 2: Those who accept Christ will be rewarded with eternal life.

•	God will not only comfort those who have suffered for His sake, but He will also welcome them into His glorious, magnificent presence.
