**Devotional Reading:** Revelation 1:1-8 **Background Scripture:** Revelation 7:9-17 **Print Passage:** Revelation 7:9-17

#### **Key Verse:**

These are they which came out of great tribulation, and have washed their robes, and made them white in the blood of the Lamb. (Revelation 7:14b, KJV)

"These are they who have come out of the great tribulation; they have washed their robes and made them white in the blood of the Lamb." (Revelation 7:14b, NIV)

#### **Questions to Consider:**

- 1. Who are the multitude of people and where did they come from that John has a vision of seeing in heaven?
- 2. What are the multitude people in heaven saying and doing?
- 3. What is it that they will never experience again?

### **Lesson Context:**

Jesus revealed God's plan for the end of the world to John in a vision, allowing John to see and record certain future events. John saw in a vision, two multitudes—the first consisting of the 144,000, represented by 12,000 from each of the 12 tribes of Israel, and the being a great standing before the throne, a number that no one can count. The saints are sealed for what is about to come. God protects them, as promised, from the trial and great tribulation that loom.
