Devotional Reading: Revelation 5:1-14 **Background Scripture:** Revelation 19 **Print Passage:** Revelation 19:1-8

Key Verse:

Let us be glad and rejoice, and give honour to him: for the marriage of the Lamb is come, and his wife hath made herself ready. (Revelation 19:7, KJV)

Questions to Consider:

- 1. What was the multitude in heaven singing and shouting about?
- 2. Who is referred to as the great prostitute or harlot in this week's lesson?
- 3. What does the metaphor of the marriage, the Lamb and bride, represent?

Lesson Context:

- The first half of Chapter 19 is devoted to a scene in heaven that features a large ______singing "hallelujah" in victory and praise to the Lord.
- The great multitude celebrates the defeat of the world's kingdoms and proclaims the Lord's universal reign.

Lesson Aims

- Discuss the implications of God's judgment for believers.
- Believe that God's judgment is inclusive of His justice and mercy.
- Affirm, receive, and enjoy the love of Christ for all, and anticipate the completion of God's plan at the end of this age.

Lesson Outlines/Key Points:

I. Hallelujah—____! (Revelation 19:1-4)

Key Point 1: In a vision, John heard the sound of many loud voices, a great multitude in heaven signing praises to the name of the Lord.

		Key Point 2: Not only should God's people praise Him for who He is, but they should also celebrate God's nature.
	II.	Rejoicing! (Revelation 19:5-8)
		Key Point 1: Heaven rejoices and expresses mighty praises to God. Key Point 2: The Lord is coming back for the Church. We want to be ready and prepared to meet the Him.
	• • What	we should rejoice in the expectation of the Lord's second coming, the time when all will join the heavenly celebration as John described in this week's lesson. Worship is always to be given to God Do You Think? Why do you think many believers are hesitant to praise God openly?
	2.	What blessings have you received for which you would want to rejoice?
