SYNOPSIS OF CLASSES

CHURCH LEADERSHIP DIVISION

PASTORS AND MINISTERS SUBDIVISION

The Pastors and Ministers Subdivision helps pastors understand their role in guiding individuals from membership to discipleship. The Pastor's Alternative for Teacher Certification (PATC) provides an alternate path for teacher certification to pastors with 3-5 years of experience. The Pastor's Advanced Training Program (PATP) is an advanced study program for pastors and comprises Phases II-IV. The program awards a *Diploma in Pastoral Studies* upon completion.

MORNING CLASSES

The Emotional Healthy Leader: Withstanding the Pressures of Leadership (PATP)

This course will explore the dimensions of spirituality that should characterize the life of the faithful minister. Students will deal with the connectedness of the preacher's devotional life, leadership tasks, relationships, and ways to transform the inner life; thus, leading a transforming church.

CHRISTIAN LEADERSHIP DIVISION

CERTIFICATION SUBDIVISION

This subdivision is designed to acquaint moderators, congress presidents, state directors, deans, and instructors with the policies and procedures governing Christian Leadership Schools. The Christian Leadership School functions under the auspices of the local church, district, state, or the National Baptist Convention, USA, Inc. Courses in this section will assist students in completing the Certificate of Progress Program (COPP) and address the process and requirements for leadership school accreditation, certification, and the recertification of deans and instructors.

MORNING CLASSES

Be Restored! God's Power for African American Women

The class will explore personal restoration and growth as women of God through discussion, inspiring stories, and thought-provoking questions centered around Nehemiah's restoration work in Israel after the devastation of war.

1007-Survey of the Old Testament

This survey will provide a general overview of the divisions, times, and places mentioned in the Old Testament. It will emphasize the nation of Israel and significant events, people, and archaeological findings.

1075-Synoptic Gospels

Focus on the Synoptic Gospels—Matthew, Mark, and Luke. Students will study the life and ministry of Jesus Christ as portrayed by these three writers. Through this comparative study, students will gain a more comprehensive understanding of Jesus' ministry.

The course will focus on understanding philosophical and Christological approaches to Christian ethics and applying biblical principles to decision-making and conduct for living.

2099A/B-Dean Certification (Parts I and II)

2099A will focus on "Christian education," historical trends, current developments, and the future of theological education in the United States of America. The class will introduce students to virtual learning. 2099B will focus on the skills, strategies, and training to build reliable and efficient CLS leadership and CLS. The discussion topics are leadership development, team building, and mentoring students. In addition, the course will introduce students to online learning and video platforms for hosting meetings and virtual training.

This class will focus on enhancing teaching skills. 2097 examines the current trends, methodologies, technological advances, and practices in Christian education and Christian teaching.

The study of the letter of James—with emphases on authorship, date, theme, and recipients—will offer an excellent tool for students looking for a more practical application of their faith.

This survey provides an overview of the New Testament, covering its divisions, periods, people, places, events, and archaeology.

This course will help teachers discover innovative ways to teach, including learning strategies and behaviors of students that lead to transformed lives.

2099C/D-Dean Certification (Parts III and IV)

This course will focus on developing skills for Christian education ministry, organizational skills, time management, and leadership development. The main aim of the course is to provide an understanding of how to establish and manage a Christian Learning System (CLS). Participants will learn how to organize and lead a CLS, including how to complete relevant paperwork online. Additionally, the course will focus on team building, leadership, and technologies required for preparing deans for the first CLS.

2100-Guidelines for Recertification of Deans

The class will focus on the administrative, leadership, and management skills needed to maintain a CLS. In addition, 2100 will explore current trends in Christian education organizations and leadership.

This course will explore historical and contemporary Christian faith, interpretations, and development of individual Christian beliefs and life-purpose statements.

SPECIALIZATION EDUCATION STUDIES SUBDIVISION

The Specialization Education Studies Program (SESP) is an advanced study program intended for those students who have completed the four phases of the Certificate of Progress Program (COPP). In addition, it is designed for those persons desiring to focus on a selected area of Christian ministry. However, any interested delegate can register for specialization courses.

MORNING CLASS

SP0004-Chistian Doctrine

This course will focus on the central doctrines of the Christian Church. In addition, the instructor will discuss critical individuals and events that gave rise to what we believe.

AFTERNOON CLASS

SP0018–Leadership Principles and Strategies

This course will examine selected biblical principles as a foundation for a religious organization's leadership and strategic development. The course will also emphasize developing a leadership philosophy, studying, and evaluating one's leadership style, working with staff and other administrators to create and implement the organization's mission, and managing the stress of leadership.

DEAN'S INTENSIVE TRAINING SEMINAR

The Dean's Intensive Training Seminar is designed to provide certified deans with an in-depth learning experience to understand their roles and responsibilities as Deans of Christian education and to explore trends and innovations to enhance the delivery and effectiveness of Christian education ministry and programs on all levels of denominational work. The seminar will be presented in six modules that focus on essential functions of the Dean's work during the SSPB Annual Conference.

Prerequisites

Prerequisites for the Dean's Intensive Training are:

- 1. Certified Dean with at least five years of experience.
- 2. Must have taken course #2100 Deans Recertification Course.
- 3. Must have served as the Dean for at least three certified leadership schools.

Module 1: Leadership and Administration in Christian Education Ministry – Review/Revisit/Reexamine Module Description:

This module is designed to provide certified deans of Christian education with a comprehensive understanding of their roles and responsibilities as deans, revisit the certification process for Christian Leadership Schools, and reexamine the CLS Manual and explain manual updates and changes in policies and procedures to ensure maintenance of educational and SSPB certification standards. Participants will gain valuable insights into effective leadership, accreditation procedures, and the significance of staying abreast of evolving educational practices within a Christian framework.

Module 2: Staffing for Success – Faculty (Instructors)/Support Staff Selection and Development Module Description:

This module will focus on developing a comprehensive framework for the intentional and prayerful selection, support and development of faculty and staff for Christian Leadership Schools and Christian education ministries. Emphasis will be placed on equipping and training faculty and staff at all levels to function as a team to ensure the delivery of quality Chrisitan education ministry that aligns with the vision, mission, and core values of the SSPB and the National Baptist Convention USA, Inc. at all levels of the denomination whether at the local, state, or national levels. Participants will explore the processes of instructor recruitment and selection, necessary qualifications, certification/recertification requirements, and the promotion of continuous education and professional development for faculty and staff.

Module 3: Christian Leadership School Administration and Strategic Management

Module Description:

This module is designed for certified deans in Christian education to provide a comprehensive exploration of essential skills needed for Christian Leadership School and Christian education ministry administration, strategic planning, and financial management. Participants will gain insights into effective registration procedures, budgeting, financing, and promotion and marketing techniques for Christian Leadership Schools and Christian education ministries.

Module 4: Zoom Administration and Training

Module Description:

This module will focus on engaging participants in an interactive learning experience on the use of Zoom in Christian Leadership Schools and Christian education ministries. Participants will review the 12-Step process for the administration and organization of a Virtual Leadership School. Participants will be engaged in an interactive training session focusing on "Zoom: Administration and Training." Participants will experience and overview of the Zoom Meeting Platform to include licensing for Zoom, administration of Zoom accounts, setting up meetings, inviting participants to meetings, screen sharing, and other properties of Zoom that can be utilized for Christian Leadership Schools and Christian education ministries.

Module 5: Practical Application of Christian Education and Leadership Principles

Module Description:

This module is designed to bridge theoretical knowledge with real-world scenarios, providing participants with handson experience in applying Christian educational leadership principles. Through engaging scenarios and practical elements, participants will navigate common challenges faced by educational leaders, developing the skills and confidence needed to lead with integrity and impact within a Christian educational context. Students will be required to collaborate, use critical thinking skills, and problem-solve to complete a group project.

Module 6: Leadership Triumphs: Articulating and Sharing Achievements as Christian Education Deans Module Description:

This specialized module is designed to empower Christian Education Deans with the skills and strategies needed to articulate and share achievements effectively. As deans play a pivotal role in steering educational institutions, this module delves into the nuances of celebrating success within the context of Christian leadership.
