9919—Paul’s Epistles and Theology

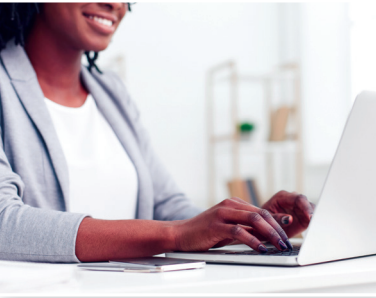
